



## TRAFFIC MARSHAL FIRST AID POLICY

### Minor Lacerations / Grazes

These should be cleaned with water, if necessary wiped with a Betadine swab and covered with a dressing, bandaid or gladwrap. (Type of cover will depend on the size of the laceration / graze).

If the rider is considered able to return to the start, treatment can take place there.

### Suspected Fractures

Ensure the rider is safe from passing traffic. If necessary use the Stop/Go Paddle to protect. The rider should be immobilised using what is needed for the particular break. E.g. Suspected fractured collar bone - immobilise using a collar and cuff. **Call the SA Ambulance Service immediately on 000.**

### Head Injuries / Major Trauma

Ensure the rider is safe from passing traffic. If necessary use the Stop/Go Paddle to protect. **Call the SA Ambulance Service immediately on 000.**

**SA Ambulance should be called on 000 immediately for all suspected fractures and major trauma.**

Please ensure that all Traffic Marshals advise the First Aider, Referee and Safety Officer by radio or mobile telephone using the numbers provided.
